Traffic

A reminder to be considerate when dropping off and picking up your children on both the Cazenove Road site and at the Common. Please do not block other drivers and road users—only park where you know it has been permitted.

Report Cards

You will be receiving the first report card of the year for your child on the 2nd November. This report will let you know how well your child is achieving, you will be told whether your child is 'working at' the expected standard for their year group 'working below' the expected standard or 'working above' the expected standard. You will receive a target for reading, writing and maths. We will be holding parents' meetings in December where you will be able to discuss your child's progress in more detail.
