
Volunteers Needed



This lags behind countries like Russia (46%), Ireland (46%), New Zealand (44%), and Australia (43%).

Step 4: Arrange an appointment to meet with the Headteacher.

Unless it is an emergency, parents will be unable to have a same day appointment, however an appointment will be made as soon as possible. The Office Manager will request some very brief details from parents regarding the nature of the meeting before the meeting can go ahead. This will ensure the staff are fully prepared for the meeting. Please do not stop members of staff during the start of the school day for an appointment, please go straight to the office.
