We have raised lots of money for our two charity events so far this year, the MacMillan Coffee Morning and the Wear Red Day.

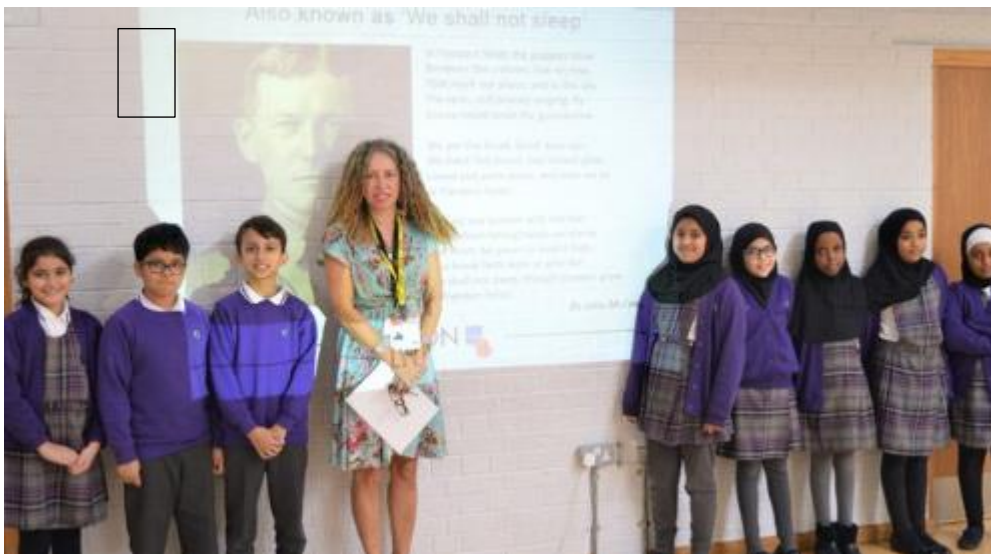
We raised **£538** from the MacMillan Coffee Morning and for the Wear Red Day we raised **£453.12**.
