### Lead-in task:

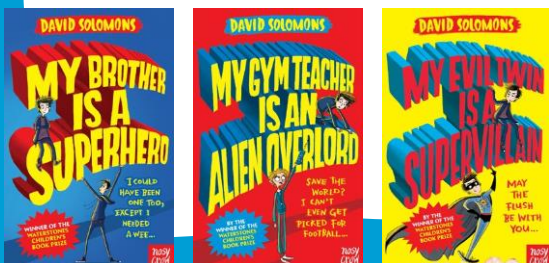
Consider how the following scenario could be exaggerated for comic effect: A group of Superheroes and Supervillains meet for the first time.
