## Germany

A long time ago, England had a King called George, he was the first King to be called George, and so we call him George I. He came from a place called Hanover in Germany.

King George didn't speak English and he spent a lot of time in Germany, so he gave some power to another man called Robert Walpole to make decisions whilst he was away. He would tell King George what parliament were talking about. He was called the 'Prime Minister' and prime means first.

The King offered Robert Walpole a house on Downing Street, near the Houses of Parliament, and whoever is the Prime Minister still lives there today – this house is called 10 Downing Street.

The current Prime Minister is the leader of the government of Britain. We vote every 4 or 5 years to choose who makes the government. One of these people becomes the Prime Minister. The role of parliament is to check all the work that the government does and to discuss and approve new laws. The government are responsible for the running of the country, led by the Prime Minister.
