Please can all parents bear in mind that all schools (in the UK and around the world) are operating under very difficult circumstances. Olive school is operating under even more difficulty, as we have pupils and staff on three sites.

Cars & Safety at the NCC/UTC site

A gentle reminder to all of our parents whose children are based at the NCC/UTC site. When you drop-off your child, please try as much as possible to not park in Basing Place itself - there is a build-up of cars happening daily which is affecting how easily the coaches can access the school at the beginning and the end of the day. There have also been a number of instances this week where cars are mounting the pavements and are not being driven responsibly outside of the school gate which puts the safety of the children and other adults at risk. For those of our parents who walk to the school gates, please make sure your child is supervised at all times and not allowed to run around the corner ahead of you. The children are under your supervision until they are inside the gates and it is your responsibility to ensure your child is behaving safely on the pavement next to the road.

Last week, I introduced our Festive Winter Gift Programme to you all and briefly outlined each of our main project ideas. One of these ideas was about supporting our community through the giving of foodbank donations to not only to our local foodbank, but also to the Samaritans charity.

Sadly, over 13 million people live below the poverty line in the UK and the need for foodbanks is increasing. Last year, well over a million emergency food packages were given out to adults and children in need.

The foodbank offers help to local people in crisis, who are often referred by specialist agencies such as social services, GP surgeries, schools, care centres and probation teams. We would be grateful if your child could bring in any of the following, to help with our collection for this worthwhile cause.

In-date tinned and packaged food, including:

baby food; pasta sauces; tinned meat and fish; biscuits; rice; tinned puddings; cereals; shower gel; tinned soup; dried pasta; snack bars; tinned vegetables; instant coffee; tea bags; toiletries: long-life fruit juice; tinned fruit; toilet rolls long-life milk;

Please note, we **cannot** accept any fresh food from the fridge or any food from the freezer. **Only** the tinned food examples listed above will be accepted. On the reverse of this letter are picture examples of what your child could bring in with them to school. Please send your child to school with their donations which will be kept by their class teacher until the day that we give these to the foodbank.

We would be incredibly grateful for any and all donations that you could make with your child, helping them to not only show warmth and kindness to strangers, but to also help them appreciate what they have.

FESTIVE WINTER GIFT PROGRAMME
This festive period our schools are raising funds and helping others in the true spirit of charity.

Dear Parent / Guardian,

Last week, I introduced our Festive Winter Gift Programme to you all and briefly outlined each of our main project ideas. One of these ideas was about supporting our community through the creation and giving of shoeboxes which will have little gifts and other little essential items for children and adults that. We will then be giving these shoeboxes to local children's homes and the Salvation Army as a token of love and care to these people in need.

Here are some step-by-step instructions for how to create your wonderful shoeboxes with your child:

- 1. Get an empty shoebox and wrap the box/lid separately in colourful wrapping paper.
- 2. On the top of the lid, attach a small label to show whether the gift is for a boy/girl (and for which age group) or if the gift is for a man/woman.
- 3. Fill your shoebox with a selection of fun toys (if your gift is for children), things to keep adults warm (such as socks, gloves, etc.), basic hygiene items and other things that you think will put a smile on the recipients face.
- 4. Personalise your shoebox by including a small handwritten note or picture, wishing the person who receives your shoebox warmth and happiness.
- 5. When you have finished filling your shoebox, place the labelled lid onto the shoebox and seal the shoebox shut.

On the back of this letter are some ideas of what could go into the shoebox, as well as some ideas for what might not be best suitable.

We will be collecting our shoeboxes up **until and including Tuesday 15**th **December 2020** as we will then organise the distribution of them to the local homes and Salvation Army. Please hand the shoeboxes in to your child's class teacher only.

As always, any generosity and support that you and your child can show for this wonderful cause will be very much appreciated and gratefully received.

Examples of wonderful things that can go into the shoebox

Toys

- dolls and stuffed toys
- toy trucks/cars
- yo-yo
- skipping rope
- balls (footballs, bouncy balls, etc.)
- small puzzles and games

School Supplies

- pens, pencils and sharpeners
- crayons and felt tip pens
- stamps and ink pad sets
- writing pads, notebooks and paper
- colouring books











Hygiene Items (please make sure these are new and unused)

- toothbrush/toothpaste
- bars of soap (Dove or Simple only)
- comb or hairbrush
- flannel



Other Items (that might be nice to add in to the shoebox for adults and children)

- warm hat, gloves or scarf
- hair accessories for little girls
- wind-up torch
- slinky spring
- pack of playing cards
- story books for children





What not to include (because of possible allergies or skin sensitivities)

- chocolate, sweets or other food items
- items with seeds or seed by-products
- any lotions or liquids, including bubbles
- anything that could have sharp edges or has glass that could break
- anything fragile and easy to break

Last week, I introduced our Festive Winter Gift Programme to you all and briefly outlined each of our main project ideas. One of these ideas was about supporting a charity in our community, St Joseph's Hospice (reg. charity number 1113125), who offer people at the end of their lives warmth, comfort and dignity at these difficult times. In the next two weeks, we will be inviting someone in from St Joseph's Hospice to talk to our children about what this wonderful charity does and how any money raised is used to help the people in need.

We are going to support St Joseph's in 2 ways. Firstly, on **Friday 18**th **December 2020**, the children will come into school wearing their own clothes for a donation of £1. This will be paid and collected via ParentPay.

Secondly, we are going to hold 2 socially-distanced bake sales, with certain year groups bringing in cakes, bakes and drink donations that can be sold. Both of these bake sales will be during school time only:

- Monday 14th December 2020 bake sale for children at the NCC/UTC (Years 2-5)

If you would like to contribute to the bake sale, please look at which date your child's year group is contributing to the sale and bring in your donations either on the day or the day before – no earlier please. For parents at the NCC/UTC, the earliest to drop in your donations will be **Friday 11**th **December 2020**.

Please do encourage your child to buy a little something sweet knowing that by doing this, you are helping members of our community through a charity that goes the extra mile for the people they care for.
