The Big Ask is a survey for children and young people aged 4-17 in England, created by the Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza. Dame Rachel's main job is to speak up for children in England; stand up for their rights; and to make sure that the people in power listen to what children need and want. One way that Dame Rachel is doing this is through the Big Ask, which is designed to give her information about what children want for their futures, as well as looking at what children think hold them back. The survey is split into different age groups, so the children will be able to fill in the version appropriate for their age. Messages from School Office


- Parents of Year 1 pupils are to return their laptops on Monday 10th May to Lower Clapton Road site (1pm-3:30pm)

RAMADAN AROUND THE WORLD

This year the Muslim holy month of Ramadan started on Tuesday, April 13. The pre-sunrise to sunset fast which lasts anywhere from 10 to 21 hours depending on where in the world you are.

The number of daylight hours varies from country to country. Muslims living in the world's southernmost countries such as Chile or New Zealand will fast an average of 11 hours while those living in northern countries such as Iceland or Norway will have an 18+ hour fast.

For Muslims living in the Northern Hemisphere, the number of fasting hours will be a bit shorter this year and will continue to decrease until 2032, which is the year Ramadan will fall during the winter solstice – the shortest day of the year. After that, fasting hours will increase until the summer solstice – the longest day of the Northern year. For Muslims living south of the equator, the opposite will happen.
