- Chickpeas, Lentils, and Beans


We will be collecting the above food items from now until **25**th **March 2022**. We will then organise the food items into boxes to be given out in w/c **28**th **March 2022**.

2. Star Innovator challenges

Pupils across the country have been challenged to complete a series of scientific challenges – all themed around the British Science Week topic of 'growth'. The challenges form part of schools' programmes of activity to support British Science week – a 10-day celebration of science, engineering, technology and maths.

Pupils in Reception and Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) are being tasked with growing a plant from a seed or seedling as part of the *Get set....grow* challenge. Pupils will nurture the plant within their own home and, to develop their knowledge of the natural world, write an account of what they have done to help the plant survive and grow.

In the *Cycle of life* challenge, Key Stage 2 pupils (Years 3 to 6) will investigate the lifecycle of either a real or imaginary animal or plant. They will research and explore the environment the animal or plant lives in, how it has adapted to its environment and learn about its food sources. Pupils will then present their findings and ideas via a piece of artwork:
