School Street at The Olive School (SS31)



The scheme will operate on:

- Clapton Square from the junction of Clarence Place to Lower Clapton Road,
- Clapton Square from the southern kerbside of the access road to the Kings Hall Leisure Centre
- Halidon Close from the southern kerbside of the access road to the Health Centre and
- Sutton Place.

Monday-Thursday during term time: 7:45-9:00am and 2:15-3:30pm, and

Fridays during term time: 7:45-9:00am and 11:15am-12:30pm

School Streets tackle congestion at the school gates and help improve the environment for walking and cycling to school.

How does this work?

- The four sections of road, as listed on page 1, will will be made a Pedestrian and Cycle Zone Monday-Thursday: 7:45-9:00am and 2:15-3:30pm, and Fridays: 7:45-9:00am and 11:15am-12:30pm during term time
- Access is permitted for those residents/addresses located inside the SS31 zone, if their vehicle is registered for exemption from SS31
- Blue Badge holders that need to access a property in the zone can apply for a special exemption. Exemptions can be applied for online at hackney.gov.uk/school-streets
- Other vehicles, including vehicles driven by visitors, parents, and school staff, and delivery vehicles, are not permitted to enter the School Street zone during the operational times unless they have been granted a special exemption
- Non-exempt vehicles entering the zone will be issued with a penalty charge notice
